
#### **Study Skills Support**

- · A pass in a BTEC HND; or
- A Foundation Degree; or
- A recognised UK or overseas equivalent; or
- · Other level 5 qualification in a related field
- Be in employment (Minimum 6 hours per week – paid or voluntary)
- There will also be the standard English language requirements of IELTS 6 or equivalent.

#### **English Language Requirements**

Students whose medium of study at HND/FdA or equivalent qualification is not English are required to produce evidence of English language proficiency at IELTS: 6.0.

#### What is this course about?

The BSc (Hons) Criminology and Criminal Justice (Top-up) programme is delivered in partnership with the University of Gloucestershire.

The course is designed for students who already have a Foundation Degree, HND, or other qualification in a subject such as criminology, uniformed public services or criminal justice, and who want to follow a programme of study that takes specialist knowledge and skills to a level relevant for a graduate career in this area.

All students will follow a programme of study designed to develop your critical thinking and research skills, and you will complete an applied research project on a topic of your choice.

#### **Study Options**

This degree is offered as a full-time study programme in just one year. This course is taught at our London campus with a flexible timetable structure. Whether you have work commitments or need to support a family while studying, our flexible learning option for 2 days a week is available to accommodate your work and personal commitments.

#### **Teaching & Learning**

Our Academic team have extensive industry and academic experience that enhances the delivery of the course allowing for practical application in today's demands of employers in the public sector. You will gain an in-depth understanding of these essential public services and the skills and knowledge required to work in your chosen area – whether on the front line or in a vital supporting role.

#### **Assessments Methods**

The assessment strategy is designed to ensure that learning outcomes are achieved and that there is a development of knowledge and skills. Independent learning is embedded within the programme and students develop a depth of understanding via synthesis, critical analysis and evaluation. Assessments are by coursework and examination with the majority of modules being assessed by coursework only. A mixture of formative and summative assessment is used. Formative assessment. and the timely follow-up by tutors with good practice feedback is used to monitor student progress and also help the student to plan, practice and prepare for the summative assignments.

#### **Career Prospects**

Graduate opportunities include: roles in the police service, prisons, probation, and border control victim support organisations, intelligence analysis, and public authorities. On successful completion of the Level 6 course, students are able to continue their studies at a post-graduate level, which includes pursuing a Masters in a subject related area

## STEP 3 – English Language Requirements

If your qualifications are from overseas you will have to meet our English Language Requirements. Our admissions team will provide you with more information after you submit an application.

#### STEP 4 - Arrange an Interview

Students will also be asked to attend an academic interview. Suitability for entry to our programmes can be demonstrated in several ways and is not limited to academic qualifications alone.

Applicants who do not meet our published entry requirements are encouraged to contact the admissions office for further advice.

**Tower Hill** (District and Circle lines), approximately 4 minutes, via Crutched Friars.


**Liverpool Street** (Central line), a very pleasant 10 minute walk!
