Assessment Workshop

English Language Requirements

If English is not your first language, you will need to demonstrate the ability to study in English. For non-native speakers of English, you must demonstrate proficiency of English equivalent to IELTS 5.5.

If you do not meet the required standard of English requirement in the assessment, you will be offered our Pre-sessional English language course to help you improve your English to the necessary level to gain admission to the Pearson HND in Public Services programme.

What is this course about?

This course is designed to meet the needs of students wishing to pursue a career in the Public Services sector, most notably the Police Service, Criminal Intelligence, Major Crime Investigation, Crime Analytics, Justice Services such as in Probation / Youth Justice, Security Services Personnel and other Criminal Justice support agencies. You will develop a firm understanding of the Justice system and criminology, human psychology and sociology, diversity, health & safety and your own personal efficiency and development in all situations where crime and criminal services specialists are employed.

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Study Options

This HND programme is offered as a full-time study programme for two years as standard. This course is taught at our London campus with a flexible timetable structure. Whether you have work commitments or need to support a family while studying, our flexible learning options; daytime or evenings and Saturdays are available to accommodate your work and personal commitments.

Teaching & Learning

Our Academic team have extensive industry and academic experience that enhances the delivery of the course allowing for practical application in today's demands of employers in the public sector. You will gain an in-depth understanding of these essential public services and the skills and knowledge required to work in your chosen area – whether on the front line or in a vital supporting role.

Assessments Methods

To gain the HND each module must be successfully completed. Assessment is a combination of coursework, assignments, projects, or an examination. All assessments are externally verified by Pearson. Students will be expected to commit at least 150 notional hours towards completing the learning outcomes per unit. This usually consists of a combination of around 60% direct teaching time and around 40% independent study time (e.g. preparations for research and assessments, background reading, etc.).

Career Prospects

On successful completion of this 2 year course, students will have strong career prospects in diverse areas of the Public Sector such as; Police officer; Major crime investigator, Criminal Intelligence analyst, Crime analyst and other careers in the public sector.

On successful completion of the HND, there is an opportunity to complete a third year 'top-up' with us studying a level 6 BSc (Hons) Criminology & Criminal Justice programme which is delivered in partnership with the University of Gloucestershire.

STEP 1 - Go to

STEP 3 - Internal English Test

If you do not have the necessary English language qualification, you will be required to sit and pass the College's internal test.

STEP 4 - Arrange an Interview

Students will also be asked to attend an academic interview. Suitability for entry to our programmes can be demonstrated in several ways and is not limited to academic qualifications alone.

Applicants who do not meet our published entry requirements are encouraged to contact the admissions office for further advice.

Tower Hill (District and Circle lines), approximately 4 minutes, via Crutched Friars.


Liverpool Street (Central line), a very pleasant 10 minute walk!
